PRODUCTION CAMP SCHEDULE

Campers will stay in the college dorms, and production time will be broken up nicely by fieldtrips.

SUNDAY

MONDAY

Campers will spend most of the day writing, completing equipment training, and completing pre-production for their films.

TUESDAY

WEDNESDAY

Campers will finish filming and work on editing and post-production.

In the evening, everyone will fieldtrip to the movies for a summer blockbuster.

THURSDAY

During the first half of the day, campers will fine-tune and finish up their films.

Students will check out of the dorms as family and friends arrive for the finale showcase! Light refreshments will follow and complete the camp.
